#### <u>Homework</u>


Using toadstools, the children need to explore how they can break the number 8 down into smaller parts.

This week in Maths we have started to look at part-whole models. These are models that show how a number can be broken down into smaller part



They are especially effective when using pictures that can easily be differentiated, in showing children how larger numbers can be broken, e.g. the 3 cupcakes can be split into 2 Mickey cupcakes and 1 Minnie cupcake:

#### 2 + 1 = 3
